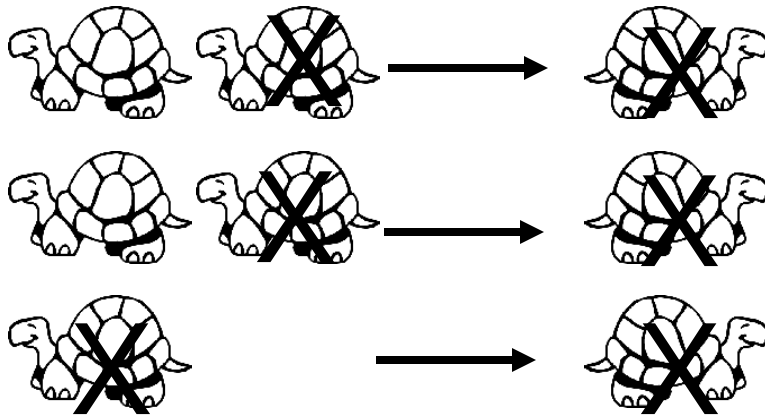


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Addition and Subtraction Word Problems Guided Lesson Explanation

#1. An easy way to do this is to cross out the turtle that left completely.



That leaves us with 2 turtles still eating away at the grass.

#2 We just need to count the dots and make sure the counts match:

$$4 + 2 = 6$$

A) $\square\square\square\square\square + \square\square\square = \square\square\square\square\square\square\square\square$
5 3 8

B) $\square\square\square\square + \square\square = \square\square\square\square\square\square$
4 2 6

C) $\square\square\square\square\square\square\square + \square\square\square\square = \square\square\square\square\square\square\square\square\square\square$
7 4 11

D) $\square\square\square\square + \square\square\square\square = \square\square\square\square\square\square\square\square$
4 4 8

As we can see, letter b follows the same exact addition sentence.

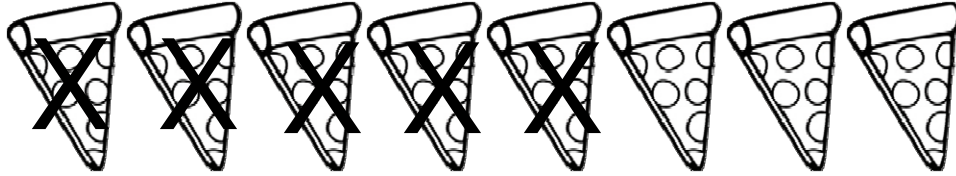


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#3

Jeremy has the 8 slices displayed below. If we cross out 5 slices, that will show us the remaining number of slices.



This leaves us with 3 slices of pizza.

This can also be written as:

$$8 - 5 = 3$$
