



Tally - Guided Lesson Explanation**Explanation#1**

Count the number of police hats. For each police hat, make a tally mark by drawing a single, vertical line. If the count becomes greater than 4, then draw a diagonal line over the previous 4 vertical lines. The combination that you form this way is called a "unit:" this is a group of 5 objects.

In the question, there are 6 police hats. We draw one unit and one tally mark, and circle the number 6.

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Explanation#2

Count the number of roses. For each rose, make a tally mark by drawing a single, vertical line. If the count becomes greater than 4, then draw a diagonal line over the previous 4 vertical lines. The combination that you form this way is called a "unit:" this is a group of 5 objects.

In the question, there are 4 roses. We draw four lines, and circle the number 4.

Count the number of flashlights. For each flashlight, make a tally mark by drawing a single, vertical line. If the count becomes greater than 4, then draw a diagonal line over the previous 4 vertical lines.

The combination that you form this way is called a "unit:" this is a group of 5 objects. In the question, there are 5 flashlights. We draw one unit, and circle the number 5.
